

From laid-back drinking dens to high-end style bars, Babička Original Wormwood Vodka has found a home in every corner of London. So join Square Meal for a bar tour that puts Babička on the map

The cocktail THE SHOP





Our Babička hunt started at The Shop in Kensal Rise, a quirky bar/social club where the furniture and artworks are all for sale. Vintage clothes fairs and 80s nights are part of the fun here, so we were expecting something a bit different. The 'witches' brew', served in an old milk bottle, didn't disappoint: a zesty combination of Babička, lime juice, passion fruit, blackcurrant and sparkling wine.

A quick taste and we were off to a very different venue in nearby Notting Hill: Montgomery Place. The Rat Pack would have felt right at home in these classy surrounds and would no doubt have ordered a round of Babička cocktails. The 'lady itch swizzle' gives Babička a starring role alongside dry vermouth, the house Montgomery Bitters, fresh tarragon and lemon zest.

Heading into central London, first stop was The Lobby Bar at One Aldwych. This hotel bar is a super-stylish spot for liquid refreshment – and what better choice than a Babička cocktail? The eye-catching

Delivered to your table in a cloud of dry ice and served with a homemade toffee apple, this

Next up, some old school grandeur at The Rivoli Bar at The Ritz London. With its glamorous 1920s décor, this cocktail lounge has been synonymous with luxury living for decades. It was the perfect setting for the elegant 'master of grey' cocktail, a suave blend of Babička, Earl Grey tea, fruit liqueur, orange peel and bergamot oil.

LET'S TWIST AGAIN

equally at home in a hotel

lounge or a party bar

Inspired by these exotic flavours, we decided to seek out a touch of the Orient at nearby Japanese restaurant Sake No Hana. With its bamboo walls and striking glass

chandelier, Ni Jū San is a bijou bar that's known for its 'twists-on-a-classic' cocktail list. A Babička 'grapefruit vodka collins'

didn't disappoint: using fresh grapefruit and the very trendy yuzu saké, this bright, fresh drink, gained a herbaceous, wormwood character from the vodka.

Next, the cocktail detectives arrived











at Donovan Bar at Brown's Hotel. This nu-Edwardian lounge offers old-school glamour with a twist – just like Babička. A trio of Babička cocktails is on the list: top marks went to 'castor'; a Champagne cocktail flavoured with homemade lemongrass syrup.

Heading to Fitzrovia, we found cosy underground speakeasy, The Lucky Pig, an old-time hoochie-coochie joint, complete with an upright piano for singalongs. We taste-tested the 'granny smash', which combines Babička with Aperol, grapefruit juice, mint, lime and orange bitters.

Refreshing – and one of your five-a-day, too.

GREAT SCOTT

From subterranean speakeasy to gilded gothic glamour at The Gilbert Scott bar at St Pancras Renaissance Hotel. This seductive space could easily double as a Merchant Ivory film set and the elegant 'rose window' cocktail suited the surroundings perfectly. This delicate drink is made with Kummel

liqueur, fennel, caraway seeds and rhubarb to complement the fennel and coriander botanicals used in Babička.

Next the sleuths headed east on the trail, aiming for Nightjar in Shoreditch. A seriously classy speakeasy, we knew we were in for a treat when the 'Nightjar barrel punch' arrived with a dark chocolate spoon and mini Oreo cookie. The punch paired Babička with four different milks (almond, rice, soya, evaporated), vanilla maple syrup and spices: creamy, but perfectly balanced.

Our hunt ended at Off Broadway, a hip homage to New York City's neighbourhood bars near Broadway Market. A welcoming spot to hang out over classic cocktails, American craft beers and burritos, it also offered up the dangerously addictive 'yellow fever martini' (Babička and Lillet Blanc).

The cocktail detectives had cracked the case. From subterranean speakeasies to neighbourhood drinking dens; style bars to hotels, there's one vodka that fits
